Recipe

Pumpkin Cheesecake

Crust:

- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- ¼ cup butter, melted

Filling:

- 2 packages (8 oz each) cream cheese, softened
- ¾ cup sugar
- 2 large eggs, room temperature, lightly beaten
- 1 can (15 oz) pumpkin
- 1¼ teaspoons ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon salt

Topping:

- 2 cups sour cream
- 2 tablespoons vanilla extract
- 12 to 16 pecan halves, chopped

Directions:

1. In a small bowl, combine the graham cracker crumbs and sugar; stir in butter. Press into the bottom of a 9-in. spring form pan, chill.



- 2. For filling, in a large bowl, beat cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Add eggs; beat on low speed just until blended. Stir in the pumpkin, spices and salt.
- 3. Pour into crust. Place pan on a baking sheet. Bake at 350° for 50 minutes.
- 4. For topping, combine the sour cream, sugar and vanilla until smooth. Spread over filling; return to the oven for 5 minutes. Cool on rack for 10 minutes. Carefully run a knife around the edge of pan to loosen; cool 1 hour longer.

Refrigerate overnight. Remove ring from pan. Top with chopped pecans. Refrigerate leftovers.

Winter Reminders

- Please keep garage doors down/ closed so water pipes are protected from freezing and bursting. And keep snow clear of your garage doors, as it can cause the doors to not close properly.
- Please remember to leave your baseboard heat on in your entryway landing area, if you have one. You can leave it on low. Not doing this could result in water lines/sprinklers freezing and result in broken/damaged lines.
- Please REMOVE welcome mats from in front of doors. They will get sucked up by the snow blower.

- Our Contractor will begin snow removal operations within approximately 1-1/2 hours AFTER two (2) inches of snow has accumulated on paved surfaces.
- For average snowfall it takes approximately 3-4 hours to clear all sidewalks.
- After snow removal, rock salt will be used on all driving surfaces, and ice melt on all walkways.
- When the forecast calls for icy conditions, we will make every effort to treat sidewalks prior to, but please note it can be slippery, so please use

- caution when the forecast calls for ice.
- The Contractor is not responsible for snow removal behind or between cars.
- Once residents have cleared and moved their cars, our Contractors can go back through and clear parking areas.
- If you are leaving for an extended period, please do not lower your heat past 55 degrees to prevent pipes from freezing.
